

Subject: [PPWR] Regulation (EU) 2025/40 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 December 2024 on packaging and packaging waste, amending Regulation (EU) 2019/1020 and Directive (EU) 2019/904, and repealing Directive 94/62/EC.

Dear Customer,

Pulsarlube is committed to ensuring that its product range complies with the regulations in force. All our teams – particularly those responsible for product management, purchasing and procurement, and compliance – are fully committed to ensuring that our product range complies with current regulations.

We hereby confirm that the products currently distributed by Pulsarlube:

- comply with the currently applicable European Directive 94/62/EC on packaging and packaging waste,
- and also comply with the provisions of European Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on packaging and packaging waste that are already applicable, in particular the requirements of Article 5(4) on substances of concern, which are identical to the provisions of Article 11(1) of Directive 94/62/EC.

Pulsarlube also requires all its suppliers to inform it immediately of any changes that could affect the regulatory compliance of the goods supplied.

Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on packaging and packaging waste, commonly referred to as the PPWR (Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation), represents a significant development for our industry and will come into force on 12 August 2026.

However, a significant part of the obligations set out in this Regulation still depends on the European Commission's gradual adoption of delegated acts, implementing acts and harmonised standards. These are intended to specify the technical and operational arrangements for the application of the Regulation, in particular:

- delegated acts laying down sustainability criteria for plastic recycling technologies,
- implementing acts introducing a harmonised labelling system and specifications for labelling requirements and formats,
- implementing acts laying down the method for calculating and verifying the recycled content,
- harmonised standards setting out the method for calculating and verifying compliance with packaging minimisation requirements,
- delegated acts setting a minimum number of cycles for reusable packaging,
- further points to be defined

These implementing measures will be adopted by the European Commission in stages between 12 August 2026 and 12 February 2030, in accordance with the timetable set out in the Regulation.

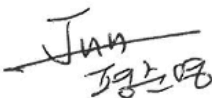
Furthermore, certain requirements will only apply after a minimum period has elapsed following their entry into force – in particular where the Regulation provides for an implementation period of at least twelve months. This means that some measures will apply from August 2027 at the earliest.

In order to offer our customers a high level of reliability and support, we are actively working on the necessary measures to ensure that **our products gradually comply with the new, applicable PPWR requirements** in line with the regulatory timetable.
